

The Public Works Department is offering on-demand Large Item Pick Up collection service up to 4 times per year for all Town residential properties.

This does not include the vegetative debris pickup that occurs in the spring and fall.

COLLECTION:

Customers should contact the Public Works Department or Town Hall to schedule a pickup. We will collect from addresses once per quarter. This still affords them a collection opportunity of four (4) collections, as in the past.

ACCEPTED ITEMS:

The following items will be collected; used automobile tires (without rims), automobile radiators, scrap metals (rims, motor parts, etc.), appliances (please secure or remove the doors from refrigerators), furniture, mattresses and box springs (2 sets per collection). As a reminder, all items placed must also be sorted into separate piles based on their type. Metal and wood should be in separate piles from other items.

PROHIBITED ITEMS:

The following items **will not** be collected: old clothes, shoes, glass items, tree limbs, stumps, leaves, yard-clearing debris, construction/demolition materials (such as lumber, toilets, windows, doors, etc.), and any hazardous materials (oil-based paint, pesticides, etc.). All normal household trash must be disposed of within your regular black trash bin.

The following items are also not permitted: boats, boats on trailers, trailers, personal watercraft, propane tanks, hot tubs and covers, and fire extinguishers.

RESTRICTIONS:

Prohibited materials, mixed piles and items that are improperly sorted will not be collected. If the items you placed on the roadside are not collected, it has been rejected and therefore must be disposed of at your own expense. Please take pride in your home and respect your neighbors. Do not leave any trash at the roadside expecting it to be picked up.

Please do not interfere with the personnel picking up large items. If large item pickup falls on your regular trash collection day, please do not block the trash bin with any other items. Keep items away from mailboxes and utility boxes (water, cable, power, etc). Citizens are also asked to be mindful of any overhead power lines and tree limbs in their area and to avoid placing items in a place where the collection trucks could be in danger of coming into contact with them.
