Town Manager Message

Summer has come to an end, and the town staff is looking forward to the fall season. There are exciting things happening, and we have several upcoming community events and activities planned in Kitty Hawk.

Our contractor is making visible progress on the Police Station building. Interior demolition is complete; exterior siding has been removed, two walls have been replaced with cinderblocks for more stability, and the foundation for the new portion of the building has been completed. The plumbing rough-in is done and the electrical work is in process. An interior and exterior concrete slab will be poured in the upcoming weeks. In addition, the roof is currently being replaced. The project is on schedule and budget. We anticipate a mid-spring move-in.

The Town's volunteer Recreation Committee has worked diligently to recommend a trail around Town Hall. They are looking for volunteers to help with this project and hope to begin work in late October. Please reach out to Town Hall for more information about this volunteering opportunity.

Dare County has started constructing a much-needed northern EMS station at 4904 N. Croatan Hwy. As part of this project, a Fire Bay will also be built for use by Kitty Hawk Fire and Rescue.

We are organizing several community events, including a community trash collection, a flu shot clinic with Outer Banks Health, a Hocus Pocus movie night, and capping off the season with our 2nd annual Santa Motorcade.

Town staff and I are committed to serving our community and making this the best place to live and work.

The Kitty Hawk Town Council recently approved a new Town Hall trail proposal by the Town's Recreation Committee. The first phase of the new trail spanning just over one mile in length, is scheduled to begin initial clearing in October 2024 with completion anticipated in March or April 2025. The Recreation Committee will be seeking volunteer assistance with building the trail. Stay informed by following the Town's Facebook page as well as email notifications!

Living with Wildlife

The Town of Kitty Hawk staff recently met with NC Wildlife Resources Commission to discuss resources and best practices when dealing with wildlife. NCWRC officer shared the following information regarding frequently asked questions about local wildlife.

Q: I saw a nocturnal animal out during the day. Does it have rabies?

A: It's unlikely. Nocturnal animals can be awake during the day for many reasons, such as being disturbed or just looking for a "midday snack". Wildlife that live in towns or neighborhoods often become comfortable around people, and may not immediately run away.

Q: What are common signs of illness, such as rabies, in wildlife?

A: Unprovoked aggression, appearing drunk or confused, inability to maintain balance, fur loss or low body weight.

Q: Will the Wildlife Resources Commission remove a wild animal that is acting unusual? A: NCWRC does not provide any trapping or wildlife removal services. If a person or pet has come into direct contact with a potentially rabid animal, contact Dare County Health and Human Services at 252-475-5080 to report a potential rabies exposure.

Q: How can I protect my pet from wildlife?

A: The best way to protect pets is by closely supervising while outside and keep dogs on a leash. Toy breeds are especially vulnerable and should never be left outside without supervision. Cats also should not be allowed to roam freely outside.

Q: What should I do if I find injured wildlife?

A: Be extremely cautious when approaching potentially injured wildlife. You can find a licensed wildlife rehabilitator at https://ncwrc.maps.arcgis.com/apps/

Town of Kitty Hawk Annual Financial Audit



Government audits are essential for maintaining transparency and accountability. In the Town of Kitty Hawk, these audits are conducted by qualified certified public accountants, who ensure the accuracy of financial statements, the effectiveness of internal controls, and the lawful use of public funds.

Auditors review financial records, assess internal controls to prevent fraud, and verify public funds are used responsibly ad align with their intended purposes. They also evaluate the performance of town officials and report any irregularities for corrective action.

The audit process includes thorough planning, risk assessments, fieldwork, and the preparation of a comprehensive report, which is submitted to the North Carolina Local Government Commission. The report is shared with the town, oversight bodies, and the public.

Kitty Hawk's annual audit occurs between August and October, with the final report available on the town's website: https://www.kittyhawknc.gov/audits/.
